HOSPITAL AND OFFICE-BASED OUTPATIENT INFUSION CLINICS

Unique aspects of hospital and office-based outpatient infusion clinics are:

- They're typically affiliated with a provider's office or hospital network.
- Some medications can only be given in this type of setting due to their potential side effects or special monitoring required.
- Most hospitals have an infusion clinic anyone can use.
